The Grace Project International (TGPI) and its school in Zambia, The Grace Institute Zambia (TGIZ) is focused on training pastors who are called to serve but face educational and financial challenges which prevent them from attending established Bible colleges and Seminaries. TGPI/TGIZ was founded, by Brian Windsor in 2012, to provide a robust grace-based theological education and ministry training that is accessible, transformational, and indigenous.

We call our graduates 'Grace Ambassadors'. They skillfully lead churches and in turn, as the church learns to be more like Jesus, families and whole communities are transformed.

The Last 3 Months At The Grace Project International/The Grace Institute Zambia

- We are teaching adult students, many of them over the age of 40, and many who have never had the opportunity to go to school! Without our guidance, they would have either not had any training at all or would have been exposed to sub-standard training, that would not have tapped into the potential that each one of our students are capable of.
- Having divided the school into satellite schools has enabled us to continue classes despite COVID and the subsequent restrictions imposed by government. When restrictions were lifted, students continued learning seamlessly without having experienced any break.
- We are in the process of preparing for something we thought we would not achieve this year - the graduation of 17 students on December 11, 2021. We are so thankful for this achievement!
- We had the opportunity to travel to Luanshya (near the city of Ndola), where we are working towards opening a school. We attended a meeting arranged by Pastor Chinyanta Chiwela to connect with other pastors who are interested in attending the school. We hope to open the new school in January 2022!
- Pastors and church leaders were given Bibles and course books which were subsidized using funds from ImpactHope. This equips them with a library so that they can effectively minister even if they do not have access to internet-enabled devices or if they need to work in areas that do not have access to the internet.
- Three Satellite School leaders now receive an allowance for their service, thus enabling them to focus on the task of teaching rather than being disquieted and not being able to fully focus on the task at hand.



30 Lead Pastors were granted subsidized tuition, enabling them to continue learning despite financial challenges.



35 students received relevant books for their courses.



Division into 4 satellite schools has enabled us to continue teaching despite COVID restrictions.

- Continue to pray for continued wisdom to handle the 4th wave of COVID that seems imminent in Zambia.

Funding Needs

- Funding is needed for additional course materials.
- Funding is needed to supply our Satellite Schools with solar lamps for use during unplanned power outages. Our goal for 2022 is to purchase at least 7 solar-powered lights and 7 rechargeable lights worth **\$1750**, that would be charged during the day, and ultimately used during classes. Students would then be able to focus their efforts on studying efficiently.
- We are happy to report that we have received funding for 2 lights thus far!
- You can purchase 1 light for \$125 and help to light up many lives!
