
With 2022 well underway, here are a few goals we have set for this coming year:






GUATEMALA

NEBAJ: HOSPITAL - SERVICIO MEDICO Y ESPERENZA

- The Hospital saw a 7% increase in the number of patients from 2020 to 2021 (Graph A).
- Over **6%** of patients in 2021 received free healthcare because they were not able to afford medical costs.
- Since 2018, there has been a 36% increase in the number of patients seen in the Hospital.
- About \$18,000 CAD in funding was used to provide medical care for those who were unable to afford healthcare expenses.
- There were fewer patients receiving subsidized healthcare in 2021 compared to 2018 but the cost of healthcare per patient has increased (Graph B).



OAXACA

Dan and Adria Fuller are the new directors at Casa Compasiva.

- In 2021, there were 434 prenatal patients, 56 nutrition consultations, 60 postpartum appointments, 20 well-child monitoring appointments (starting Jun '21), 12 general appointments, 20 births (in house), and **3** births transferred.
- Historically, Casa has had 50% of the births at the facility and a 50% transfer to the hospital during labour. This year, 86% of births were at Casa Compasiva and only 14% were transferred to hospital.
- Since prenatal classes were held online this year, there was sadly a decrease in personal interaction with clients. Everyone is looking forward to the return of partial in-person classes again.





KENYA: WATER WELLS



WATER FOR THE MAASA

- In 2019, ImpactHope committed to drilling a well at the • Olkesumet Prayer Response Center in Kenya. This well will impact over 500 people within a 5km radius, providing water for many of the Maasai people and their animals.
- This well is a saving grace for people who used to walk 20+ km to retrieve water.
- This Water Well Project is overseen by a committee of Kenyans.

Phase 1: A borehole was drilled and capped last year.

Phase 2: Solar pump & water tower will be installed in Jan. of 2022. <u>Phase 3</u>: Planning for agriculture and other efforts in the region.

HAIT

Community development in Fort Jacques, Haiti with a focus on education over the last year:

- A complete hot protein meal is served every school day to 7 staff and 29 children.
- Salaries were paid in full for teachers through the summer months and a half-salary bonus in December. Consistent income has greatly increased the teachers' feeling of security which positively impacts their performance!
- Regular training for teachers every month has improved teaching styles and increased their confidence levels.





MUSIC & MINISTRY

Isaac and Fer are worship leaders at Koinonia, their local church.

- Piano, violin, and voice lessons were provided for 28 students in 2021
- 2 student recitals held, aiving families the opportunity to celebrate their kids' progress.
- Bible studies taught to missionary kids by Isaac:

a. Weekly Virtual Bible study: 8 kids b. In-person Bible study: 10 kids

- Fer has been serving as a volunteer doula since May '21, supporting 6 births at Casa Compasiva.
- Isaac and Fer serve on the board of directors of Casa Compasiva.

ZAMBIA

The Grace Project International (TGPI) and its school in Zambia, The Grace Institute Zambia (TGIZ) is focused on training pastors who face educational and financial challenges which prevent them from attending established Bible colleges and seminaries.

- The number of TGIZ graduates in 2020 increased from 8 to 18 in 2021!
- 11 of the students were pastors. With an average congregation size of 75 people, this means that TGI has a positive, transforming effect on more than 825 people!
- Internationally partnered with two new organizations to join the global Bible school community. Additionally, 4 TGI Satellite School Partners were added to run 4 TGI schools in Lusaka. (Increase from the 1 school that ran in early 2021). This structure helped TGI to stay open, even in seemingly impossible conditions and changing rules.
- Through God's provision and faithfulness, TGIZ ended the year without a financial deficit.



GRACE-BASED THEOLOGICAL EDUCATION

Stephen Chipeta, a first year student at TGIZ, is a successful lead pastor in Lusaka with a great weekly attendance. Shortly after classes began, he wanted to drop out, but the director of TGPI provided the encouragement and support he needed. Stephen went from failing grades to a B+!

He is now preparing to become an apprentice teacher in his 2nd year at TGIZ.



HAITI CONTD .:



Despite local political unrest and insecurity in Haiti, the number of students increased from 27 to 39 students! Because of generous donors like you, Fort Jacques is functioning well and providing all students with a hot meal each day, which motivates the children to return day after day and impacts their overall performance in school!

PALMA SORIANO

- In 2021, a total of 226 needy families were supported with a variety of food and families of 168 shepherds received an average salary of \$18 USD per month.
- Jorge and Sandra provided food packages that include rice, cooking oil, chicken, and beans and are grateful for the opportunity to serve the community.





ACTS OF LOVE & SERVICE BRING HOPE

Deborah is a 9-year-old girl who comes from a very poor family. She lives with her mother, father, grandmother, and a 13-year-old sister. Last year she fell sick with dengue and her older sister got COVID. This ministry supported her for two months until she recovered. This encouraged her father to go back to church which greatly strengthened the whole family in their faith!

CAMAGUEY

Pastor Sponsorship:

- 46 Pastors and their families were helped in 2021!
- Given that the salaries of pastors are very low and the cost of living is very high, this initiative is highly beneficial to pastors and their families. They are very grateful to receive monthly support!

Food Program:

• With Carlos & Rosa's help, 103 families and seniors received monthly food bags, which included a bag of rice, beans, cornflour, chicken, spices, soap, detergent, and noodles.



Kids Program:

- Churches in Cuba were closed for almost a year, so the ministry focused on the poor kids in the countryside. 120 kids (10 kids/month) were supported.
- Bags of food, worth \$15 CAD, were provided. These included things that families could hardly afford such as cookies, candies, juice, yogurt, etc. This ministry gained tremendous response and received monthly requests from churches asking for similar support!

CANADA

BRITISH COLUMBIA

Ministry to migrant workers from Mexico and Guatemala is led by Ellie & Lila Quezada.

- In 2021, 60 Bikes, 60 evangelistic books, 60 audio Bibles were delivered.
- They served as interpreters for funerals, doctor/hospital visits, practical support in day-to-day activities (internet, banking, communication with employers, etc.) in about 15 instances.
- Discipleship/Mentoring: Home support was provided to people struggling with Covid, anxiety, and fear. This ministry grew to 12 people over the course of 7 months. Many people found renewed courage and hope for the most difficult days.

Ministry for Migrant Workers in Ontario is led by Julio Farfan.


• The ministry reached over **40 migrant workers** in Ontario in 2021.

ONTARIO

- Julio was able to serve the needs of many workers, through various tasks, including trips to the hospital, as well as providing food and other amenities during their quarantine periods in Hotels.
- 3 workers made a profession of faith. Julio was able to organize a meet-up and church service in August at a local park with about 40 workers in attendance. The service was followed by a delicious meal and a game of soccer. This was 'very needed' by many!
