One thing that stands out this past year is this - the world is rapidly changing. As the cost of living is increasing all around us, we are shocked by the higher prices of commodities. Imagine the state of the poor in impoverished countries before the pandemic, barely surviving before the pandemic, and now barely coping with the increased prices for the necessary basic items for life. This past year, the needs around the world have continued to escalate. Not only have people seen incredible inflation, but the supply chain has also weakened many countries' economies. Increasing political turmoil and the war in Ukraine have challenged the fight against poverty.

2022 has shown us again that when things are bleak and dire, people like you respond with open arms to do what is needed to meet the growing needs. We are so grateful for your partnership as we provide hope for many in need – teachers in need of a salary, children in need of an education, children in need of a loving home, a single mother in need of food, a sick patient in need of medical care and medicine, a recent widow in need of shelter and a means of income, seeds to be planted and goats to be raised... Goals for this coming year:


- Financial stability in some of our key projects

IMPACTNOW 2022 EVENTS

ImpactNow events are Covid-safe, family-friendly fundraising events to support the projects of ImpactHope while encouraging people to actively participate in making an impact right where they are! Two ImpactNow events were held in September and October 2022.

- Over 75 runners and 26 volunteers ran together in Caronport, SK, to raise funds for Casa Compasiva, our birthing center in Oaxaca. The event was sponsored by Speargrass Homes and brought much joy to families and little children who dressed up in costumes.
- An event was also held in Vancouver, led by Lila Quezada and several others, to raise funds for Casa Compasiva.









GUATEMALA

NEBAJ: HOSPITAL - SERVICIO MEDICO Y ESPERENZA


- The hospital saw a slight decrease of just under **7%** in the number of patients being treated from 2021 to 2022 (Graph A).
- Over 6.7% of patients in 2022 received free healthcare because they could not afford medical costs.
- Since 2018, there has been a 27.5% increase in the number of patients seen in the Hospital.
- Under \$16,500 CAD was needed and in large part generated in Guatemala to provide medical care for those unable to cover their healthcare expenses
- There was a slight decrease in the number of patients receiving subsidized healthcare in 2022 but the **cost of providing this care per patient increased** slightly. (Graph B).





There have been efforts to improve education in Huehuetenango, including programs to improve school infrastructure and teacher training.

Funds were provided to support a school struggling with sustainability following covid.

CUBULCO

- Alejandro and Kathryn Ortiz have grown their church community from 3 families to around 75 people including kids. They serve through home visits, home service prayers, preaching, and Bible studies.
- They supported the process of the recognition of K'ub'ul as another Mayan Language through meetings and marches.

- They welcomed 12-hour-old Jasmine, their youngest ever, while Marisol graduated high school!



A HOME TO HEAL IN

Tat's Place welcomed baby girl Esmeralda. The Blackburns think she is about two years old. A couple of months ago, she was in a house fire and received burns to about 30% of her body. She has recently returned from the burn hospital in Lima and will be at Tat's Place for a while. She is still recovering and needs further treatment.

SHELTER OF HOPE (NAIROBI & KAGAN)

- A total of **360** students enrolled in two schools.
- Total of 40 students sat for 2 major countrywide national exams (Grade 6 & 8) in December 2022.
- **55 students** graduated from Kindergarten.
- 350 students and teachers were supplied books, chalk, marker pens, chalks and dusters.

Food Program:

• 350 students & 29 staff benefited from the daily two-meal program.



HELP MWALE REACH THE FINISH LINE!

19-year-old Mwale Joseph, one of Kenya's brightest, is achieving his dreams of completing his B.Sc in Biomedical Sciences. Out of other candidates who sat for the school's national examination, Mwale was in the top 2.4% in all of Kenya, with over 800000 students testing in grade 12. Though Mwale has been funded an initial amount to join University, he will need at least \$5000 a year for his four-year university course.

MALAWI

OAXACA

Dan and Adria Fuller were the directors at Casa Compasiva in 2022.

- In 2022, Casa successfully brought **58 new mothers** into the facility for education, prayer and care.
- Casa has expanded their natural supplement offerings by providing and making some herbs and lotions available to clients.
- Casa saw and supported 96 mothers with various services and care, 17 births within Casa plus two
 others that had to transfer to the hospital during the process. 30 mothers came back for herbal bath
 treatments, 48 well-child consultations, 29 mothers scheduled extra nutritional consulting
 appointments with us to learn about healthy eating, vitamins, etc. to be as healthy as possible during
 pregnancy.



SHARING THE GOSPEL THROUGH ACTS OF SERVICE



Casa Compasiva is working and partnering with a ministry in the city that works and supports women caught and trapped in the sex trade. This partnership enables Casa to provide prenatal care to these women when needed, help them by speaking God's truth about who they are into their lives and provide them with safe, peaceful care.

We are working with Pastor Moses in Dedza Malawi on the following:

- Agriculture: 10 widows were supported to expand meat goat production in 2022.
- 250 families received seed packs for replanting due to floods.
- Gender-Based Violence: 123
 couples have been sensitized for
 change through GBV Mindset
 Change Seminars.
- Leadership: 160 pastors trained in pastoral ministry to help communities in discipleship, food and economic security programs.
- Education & Orphan care: 10 kids



Evidence is an orphaned girl who was rescued from a forced marriage and sent to school.

KENYA: WATER WELLS



HOPE FOR THE MAASAI: AGRICULTURAL INITIATIVES

In 2019, ImpactHope committed to drilling a well at the Olkesumet Prayer Response Center in Kenya. This well impacts over **500 people within a 5km radius**, providing water for many Maasai people and their animals.

- Over Phases 1 & 2, pump installation was completed successfully, and two tanks with a capacity of 2000 litres each were delivered.
- Solar energy powers the pump. When sunny, it does a good job of filling the tanks with up to 20,000 litres within 6 to 8 hours

We are currently in Phase 3 focusing on long-term agricultural solutions like fencing, clearing the land, cultivation, procuring seeds, fertilizer, and tools, and building a storage house.

ZAMBIA

The Grace Project International (TGPI) and its school in Zambia, The Grace Institute Zambia (TGIZ), is focused on training pastors who face educational and financial challenges which prevent them from attending established Bible colleges and seminaries.

- A new FREE office! A sublet model paid TGIZ's rent and provided a modest income of about \$190 CND.
- Increase in students from 22 to 75. This reduced to 61 due to the extreme financial hardship of some of our students.
- Training of additional **three school Partners** for 2023. The goal in 2023 is to increase the number of schools from 6 to 10.
- 17 students graduated. This brings the total to 47 graduates over the last three years.
- Provided solar lights for six schools, a bicycle for a teaching partner, 150 student Bibles,
 450 BTCP course books, one new course, one partner's manual, and four teacher's manuals.







HAITI

Community development in **Fort Jacques, Haiti** with a focus on education over the last year:

- A complete hot protein meal is served every school day.
- 46 kids are enrolled from preschool to grade 4.
- Salaries were paid in full for teachers through the summer and up until school opened in November.
- The most meaningful event of 2022 was the Christmas gathering for a time of worship, a time to hear the Word explained and a time to eat a meal together.





TRUSTING IN GOD'S PROVISION

Everisto has been travelling a long distance to get to his satellite school. He is dedicated to ensuring his students have a tutor present all the time. When he couldn't afford the bus, he would walk for over an hour to get to class. We are happy to report that he was gifted a bicycle!



This thoughtful donation helps him get to school quicker and save money on transportation. Everisto is himself a 'Grace Ambassador,' a recent graduate of TGIZ.

HAITI CONTD.:



Despite local political unrest and insecurity in Haiti, the number of students increased from **39** to **46**! Because of generous donors like you, **92 people** (parents, kids from the school, members of the church, and some people at home) were fed a hearty Christmas meal.





CUBA

PALMA SORIANO

- In 2022, Jorge and Sandra served a total of 78 families that
 received boxes of food that included rice, beans, oil, chicken,
 and eggs. 14 Pastors and their families were provided additional
 funds, helping to support their families and the ministry in their
 churches. Many pastors live in poverty to fulfil their calling.
- **456 children** (38/month) were blessed through special programs, bringing them the word of God and food.







HOPE FOR 5-YEAR-OLD MARYAM

Maryam was diagnosed at age two with a genetic disease called Neurofibromatosis, which has caused partial blindness. Maryam gathers with her siblings, Lucas and Eva (aged 2 & 1), every Sunday to serve faithfully with their parents, Orlando and Gianni. Despite their circumstances, they hope in the mercy of God. They are grateful for all the donors who have blessed them.

Cuba had an average inflation rate of 89%* in 2022. (EIU)

CAMAGUEY

Pastoral Sponsorship:

- 196 people, including 17 children were blessed in 2022!
- Given that the salaries of pastors are very low and the cost of living is very high, this initiative is highly beneficial to pastors and their families. They are very grateful to receive this support!

Food Program:

 With Carlos & Rosa's help, 262 children and 24 seniors received monthly food bags, which improved their diet and kept them encouraged.



Kids Program:

This project is twofold - children's clubs and special help for children.

- Children and their families have seen the hand of God blessing their lives. Kids Clubs help families strengthen their faith in God.
- Through the food program, children have received food and sweets their parents could not afford.

Alejandro is an 11-year-old boy who has benefited from the Kids Program. His parents abandoned him, so he lives with his grandfather. He eats only one meal a day, and depends on the generosity of his neighbours to survive.

Bikes and gospel material for Migrant Workers

The ministry to migrant workers from Mexico and Guatemala is led by **Eleazer & Lila Quezada.** Lila continues to be involved with Casa Compasiva fund-raising, promotion in local churches, writing and editing materials on their behalf, while Ellie continues his involvement with the migrant workers in the Delta area, picking up, fixing, and delivering bikes to workers who need them, sharing gospel materials, an audio Bible, and prayer.

VICTORIA CITY, B.C. David Slemin leads the outreach ministry in Victoria City. David partnered with ImpactHope in October 2022. David catered to the homeless and hurting, bringing them love, compassion, personal care, and emergency supplies.

The initiative doubles as a job skills training and mentoring program for the vulnerable in the community.

ONTARIO



The Bible study group hosted a lovely Christmas dinner with gifts for Guatemalan workers

Julio Farfan continues to serve migrant workers living and working in the Stratford area. Support is provided through transportation to medical appointments, banking needs, and social and mental health assistance. 110 workers celebrated Independence Day in August. They were blessed with fellowship, food and a friendly soccer game!

INDIA



Love One Another Ministries (LOAM) is a faith-based ministry reaching orphans, providing education support, and training pastors in India. Funds were also provided to support the ministries of **4** pastors.
