PROJECT UPDATES: MIGRANT WORKER MINISTRY, ONTARIO



EXTENDING SUPPORT BEYOND BORDERS

The Migrant Worker Ministry in Ontario is a source of hope and support for individuals who leave their homes to work in Canada's agricultural sector. Led by Julio Farfan, this ministry recognizes the unique challenges faced by migrant workers, including language barriers, cultural differences, and feelings of isolation. With a focus on **providing practical assistance, emotional support, and spiritual guidance** to around 80 workers, this ministry plays a crucial role in improving the well-being and quality of life for migrant workers in Ontario.

IMPACT STORY - From Tragedy to Hope: Lubia's Journey

"In Guatemala, I had the humbling opportunity to visit the families of two migrant workers, one of whom was renewing his contract, reaffirming his commitment to supporting his loved ones from afar. Amidst the warmth and embrace of their homes, I encountered Lubia and her children—a family whose lives had been forever altered by tragedy.

Last year, Lubia's husband, returning from his job in Quebec, was involved in a devastating motorcycle accident upon his arrival in Guatemala. The aftermath left Lubia in a coma for three agonizing months, alongside her young daughter, who shared a similar fate for two harrowing months.

The toll of this tragedy was immense—Lubia lost her leg, and the family's world was shattered. Yet, amidst the darkness, there was hope. Through your generous support, we contributed towards the cost of Lubia's upcoming surgery and the fitting of a prosthetic limb." - **Julio**
