EMPOWERING VULNERABLE GROUPS IN KENYA

As 2025 draws to a close, KEDHAP Foundation, in partnership with ImpactHope, continues to bring hope and health to some of the most vulnerable communities in western Kenya. Through your support, lives are being transformed in practical and powerful ways.

Empowering Girls to Stay in School

In many communities, lack of access to basic hygiene products forces girls to miss school or drop out altogether. Thanks to generous supporters, 4,900 girls received sanitary towels and underwear over the past three months. KEDHAP's team also provided life skills and empowerment sessions, helping young women grow in confidence and understand their value. These interventions are ensuring that girls can pursue their education with dignity and hope for a better future.



Caring for Adolescents Living with HIV / AIDS

Adolescents living with HIV face daily challenges — from maintaining proper nutrition to traveling long distances for treatment. Through your partnership, KEDHAP has provided:

- Maize supplies to support nutrition and strengthen immune systems.
- Transport assistance to help youth attend their clinic appointments.
- Mosquito nets to prevent malaria, which poses a serious threat to those with compromised immunity.

A total of **258 adolescents** benefited from this program. Health workers at local Ministry of Health clinics report that KEDHAP's support has been a lifeline, especially after the withdrawal of major U.S. government funding earlier this year.

Protecting Mothers and Infants



KEDHAP also reached out to **142 lactating mothers**, providing mosquito nets to protect them and their babies from malaria — reinforcing the belief that prevention is better than cure. These simple interventions are saving lives and bringing peace of mind to families who have so little yet remain so resilient.
