



Empowering Change

Donations Remain Consistent


- Overall growth and resilience:** Donations increased from \$847K in 2019 to \$1.12M in 2025—an overall growth of about 33%, reflecting strong donor trust over time.
- Post-pandemic recovery and momentum:** After a dip in 2020, donations rebounded in 2021 and grew steadily through 2023, surpassing pre-pandemic levels.
- Stability at a higher level:** Funding in 2024-2025 remained consistently above \$1.1M, indicating a stable and maturing funding base.
- This trend highlights ImpactHope's resilience and growing capacity to fund sustainable, locally-led work across the communities we serve. * 2020 – first year of Covid



Evolution of Funding Allocation: Impact Trips Over the Years



- Strong emphasis on projects:** The majority of funding (~85%) was directed toward projects, reinforcing ImpactHope's commitment to long-term, locally led, and sustainable initiatives.
- Mission Teams:** 67 total participants –
 - 5 teams served internationally
 - 3 focused on construction and community development in Guatemala
 - 1 served in Cuba (ministry and community work)
 - 1 served in Mexico (Medical/Dental outreach)



KEDHAP, Kenya

The Kenya Economic Development and Human Advancement Program (KEDHAP) Foundation is a community-based, faith-inspired organization addressing poverty and vulnerability in Kisumu and Nandi County, Kenya through integrated interventions in education, health, gender equality, peacebuilding, and sustainable livelihoods.

Rooted in local leadership, KEDHAP partners with schools, clinics, churches, and grassroots groups to deliver cost-effective, measurable, and lasting impact aligned with Kenya's development priorities and the UN Sustainable Development Goals.

1. Education: Opening Pathways to the Future

KEDHAP continues to ensure that vulnerable children—especially girls—can stay in school and transition successfully to higher education.

- **22 students** supported with full secondary school scholarships
- **328 students** supported with full school fees over the past decade
- **80% KCSE pass rate** among sponsored students
- **4 girls** achieved direct university entry in 2025
- **8 schools** equipped with water tanks, benefiting 3,742 students
- **1,336 students** benefited from new textbooks in 4 schools

Impact: Improved school retention, stronger academic performance, and increased access to post-secondary education.

2. Health & HIV/AIDS Support: Restoring Dignity and Hope

In a year marked by reduced public health funding, KEDHAP's support became a critical lifeline for vulnerable families.

- **474 people living with HIV/AIDS** received food and transport support to maintain ARV treatment
- **474 adolescents and adults** received psychosocial counselling
- **400 mosquito nets** distributed:
 - 258 vulnerable adolescents
 - 142 breastfeeding mothers
- **2 health facilities** equipped with **10,000-litre water tanks** to improve sanitation and infection prevention

Impact: Better treatment adherence, reduced malaria risk, and improved dignity and wellbeing for vulnerable households.

3. Women Empowerment

Menstrual health support continues to be one of the most transformative interventions for keeping girls in school.

- **6,121 girls** received menstrual health and dignity kits
- **27,721 girls** reached with menstrual support over the past five years
- **2,800+ youth and adults** reached through life-skills training, mentorship, and HIV prevention education

Impact: Increased attendance, confidence, safety, and leadership among adolescent girls.

4. Peacebuilding & Social Cohesion

KEDHAP works in historically divided communities to foster reconciliation and youth leadership.

- **874 youth and community members** engaged in peacebuilding activities
- **67 youth** trained as Peace Ambassadors
- **8 sports-for-peace** events and **4** community dialogue forums

Impact: Reduced inter-ethnic tension and strengthened community trust.

5. Food Security & Climate-Resilient Livelihoods

KEDHAP supports households to adapt to climate shocks and strengthen long-term resilience.

- **260 individuals** received certified seeds
- **71 smallholder farmers** supported through interest-free fertilizer and input financing
- Promotion of drought-resistant crops and organic farming

Impact: Improved food security, environmental stewardship, and household resilience.


Penina's Journey—The Power of Educating One Girl

For Penina, completing secondary school was never a certainty. Growing up in a community where poverty and social pressure often lead girls toward early marriage, continuing her education felt like a distant dream. University was almost unimaginable—no one in her extended family had ever reached that milestone.

That changed when Penina received a secondary school scholarship through KEDHAP's education and female empowerment programs, supported by ImpactHope. With her school fees covered and consistent encouragement, Penina was able to stay in school, focus on her studies, and begin to believe that her future could be different.

In the 2025 Kenya Certificate of Secondary Education (KCSE) examinations, Penina achieved a grade that qualified her for direct university entry, **becoming the first child in her extended family to reach this level of education.** Her success represents more than a personal achievement—it marks a turning point for her family and a source of inspiration for her community.

Today, Penina's story is already encouraging younger girls to stay in school and dream beyond early marriage and the limitations of poverty. Her journey is a powerful reminder that when one girl is given the opportunity to learn, the impact can break cycles of poverty and open doors for generations to come.



Shelter Of Hope, Kenya

The year 2025 marked significant growth and resilience for Shelter of Hope (SOH) despite widespread drought and economic hardship in Homa Bay and Migori counties. Through education, feeding programs, medical outreach, widow empowerment, and relief response, SOH continued to restore dignity, strengthen livelihoods, and nurture hope among vulnerable children and families.

Key Impact Highlights

- **600 students** received quality education at Shelter of Hope Academy, supported by 35 teachers.
- SOH Academy ranked **1st out of 48 schools in Rangwe Sub-County** in the Grade 9 National Exams.
- **600 Daily meals** were provided, eliminating school dropout and improving academic performance.
- **570 community members** accessed **free medical care** during a 4-day medical camp; 10 individuals committed their lives to Christ.
- **400 households** received **emergency food relief** during drought and famine affecting over 200,000 people in the region.
- **30 widows** were empowered through the **Sheep & Goats Livelihood Project**.
- **200 youths and teens** were equipped through a week-long **mentorship and life-skills** camp; 35 made faith commitments.



1. *Shelter of Hope Academy ranked 1st out of 48 schools in Grade 9 national exams, a powerful testament to dedicated teachers and sustained support.*

2. *During drought and famine, Shelter of Hope reached vulnerable families with food relief & medical care, restoring hope to hundreds in crisis.*

3. *Through the sheep and goat program, widows are rebuilding livelihoods with dignity—creating income, food security, and hope for their families.*

4. *Daily meals and quality education at Shelter of Hope keep 600 students learning, and staying in school—nearly eliminating dropout rates.*

Participation & Reach

- **Education & Learning:** 600 students equipped with learning materials; teachers supported with teaching resources, contributing to top academic performance.
- **School Feeding Program:** Breakfast and lunch provided throughout the year to students and teachers, increasing enrollment by 80 students.
- **Community Medical Outreach:** 200 children and 300 adults received free medical services, prioritizing the elderly and most vulnerable.
- **Widows Empowerment:** Livestock distribution restored dignity and income security for widows rebuilding their livelihoods.
- **Relief Food Distribution:** 2,000 children and 400 adults received essential food packages, easing hunger during crisis.



Impact Story: Pauline's Journey

Pauline Anyango, 14, began her education at Shelter of Hope Academy with determination and a love for learning. In 2025, she sat her Grade 9 National Exams and **emerged as the top student, scoring 63 out of 73 points.**

Just one week before her results were released, Pauline's father—her family's sole provider—passed away. Grief and uncertainty left her unable to report to high school. When Shelter of Hope learned of her situation, they stepped in immediately, raising funds for tuition, travel, uniforms, and supplies.

Pauline is now enrolled at Moi Nyabohanse National Girls School, with SOH committed to supporting her through her education as she pursues her dream of becoming a nurse. Her mother's joy and gratitude reflect the lasting impact of timely, compassionate support.

For many adolescent girls in rural Kenya, a lack of access to sanitary towels remains a hidden but powerful barrier to education. Each month, girls are forced to miss school, withdraw from class participation, or risk embarrassment simply because they do not have basic menstrual supplies.

In 2025 alone, 6,121 adolescent girls received menstrual health support, and 27,721 girls have been reached over the past five years.

KEDHAP teams visited partner schools to distribute sanitary towels and facilitate girls' health education sessions. School leaders report that these efforts are making a measurable difference—partner schools have seen reduced absenteeism, fewer dropouts, and fewer cases of teenage pregnancy. Consistent access to sanitary towels has helped girls remain in class, participate fully, and continue their education with dignity.

Impact Stories: Faith's Voice

Faith, a Grade 9 student from Songhor Comprehensive School, shared how deeply this support has changed her life:

"When I was on my monthly period and didn't have sanitary towels, I felt too shy to come to school. No one could buy pads for me, so I stayed home. This lowered my self-esteem and made it hard to participate in class.

Thanks to KEDHAP Foundation for improving our lives through sanitary towel provision. I can now attend all my lessons and continue with my education."



Clean Water & Agriculture, Kenya

Access to clean water has been a game-changer for the Maasai communities. In 2025, the Olkesumet borehole continued to be a vital lifeline for the Maasai community in Kajiado. Since its rehabilitation, the borehole has maintained a strong and consistent flow of clean water. New underground aquifers have opened, increasing water output and allowing the community to expand how the water is used for people, livestock, and agriculture.

Growing Reach and Daily Use

The borehole now serves a growing number of households, with community members collecting water daily using motorbikes and donkeys. Due to prolonged drought conditions in the region, the number of animals relying on this water source has increased significantly, including both cows and goats. To support this growth, a large water trough was purchased to ensure safe and reliable access for livestock.

This year also marked an important step toward **long-term sustainability**: a pipeline was extended to a nearby homestead, moving the project closer to its original objective of home-to-home water supply.

Agriculture and Food Security

Access to reliable water has transformed surrounding land into productive farmland. In 2025, the community continued to cultivate vegetables and crops that contribute to both nutrition and income:

- Spinach & kale: Produced year-round, yielding approximately 35-50 kg every two days on a rotating basis
- Beans & maize: Currently growing
- Bananas: Entering early harvest stage
- Yam: Planted and nearing harvest

These crops are improving household food security while also creating small income-generating opportunities, especially for women. Our next focus is on supplying clean water to Pokot, Western Kenya.

Soil & Soul Revival, Madagascar

In 2025, ImpactHope in collaboration with Foundations for Farming (FfF) strengthened food security and livelihoods in Madagascar through sustainable, climate-smart agriculture. Working with local partners, farmers were trained in the Pfumvudza (Foundations for Farming) method—an approach proven to increase yields, reduce costs, and restore the land.

Highlights

- **1,656 people** trained in sustainable agriculture
 - **22% increase** compared to 2024
 - Training reached **11 of Madagascar's 24 regions**, including 10 new regions
- **184 farming plots** established
 - Average size: **1,200 square meters**
 - Developed through a **special training program** for retired participants (June 2025)
- **Increased crop yields:**
 - Rice: **6 tons** per hectare (**up from 5.2 tons** in 2024)
 - Maize: **4.93 tons** per hectare (**up from 4.76 tons** in 2024)
- Farmers received **rice seeds** to support the **2025/2026** farming season

Ankohonana Miarina: Building Self-Sufficient Communities

The Ankohonana Miarina project supports vulnerable households by providing housing, agricultural land, and skills training.

- 5 new households joined in 2025
- 12 households are now benefiting in total



Impact Story: From Barren Land to Thriving Fields

"Before adopting the Pfumvudza method, my yields were low and farming discouraged me. Since applying this technique, the work is well organized, enjoyable, and less physically demanding. What I appreciate most is the beauty of the farm—clean, orderly, and pleasant to be in."

Florine's experience reflects how improved farming practices can restore dignity, motivation, and pride in agricultural work.

"I am a beneficiary of the Ankohonana Miarina project, and my life has completely changed. Before, I struggled to produce cereals. Now, my yields have increased, and I can grow enough vegetables to feed my family and sell at the local market." - Jean Felix Raokotandratsara (Photo 2)



Jean Felix also shared how the encouragement, community support, and daily prayers organized by trainers helped bring harmony to his family life.

Community Development, Malawi

Christian Faith Community Church in Malawi (CFCC)

In Malawi, ImpactHope partners with the Christian Faith Community Church (CFCC), led by Pastor Moses, to support some of the country's most vulnerable communities through holistic, locally led initiatives. These programs respond to persistent challenges such as poverty, food insecurity, cholera outbreaks, early marriage, and limited access to education and healthcare.

The Numbers Speak Volumes!

Impact Story: Clean Water in Times of Crisis

In 2025, ImpactHope distributed **63,360 water purification packages** to communities in Malawi, providing access to over **630,000 litres of safe drinking water**. These supplies arrived at a critical time, as severe flooding displaced thousands of families and increased the risk of cholera and other waterborne diseases.

Working alongside local partners and authorities, the packages were distributed in emergency camps and vulnerable communities, helping protect families from preventable illness. Access to clean water restores dignity, stability, and hope during times of crisis.

The Grace Project Training Center



In 2025, The Grace Project Training Center continued equipping pastors and church leaders through its Distance Learning program.

By the Numbers

- **7 students enrolled in one Distance Learning cohort**, running through mid-2026
- **April 2025 graduation ceremony – 28 students** graduated
- A reduction in funding has created significant challenges; however, we are refocusing our efforts to address the growing needs in rural communities.
- The interest and opportunity remain strong as we seek to meet the biblical training needs of pastors serving in underserved areas.




Impact Story: A Renewed Passion To Serve

Julius Chisanga enrolled in The Grace Training Project with a deep desire to preach and teach the Gospel—but without the confidence or training to know where to begin. Through the program, his understanding and confidence have steadily grown. Courses opened his eyes to how Scripture should be studied and applied, transforming the way he approaches ministry. Today, Julius shares that the program has not only strengthened his knowledge but also shaped his character and leadership.



Haiti (Medical Missions)

Over the past year, ImpactHope's partnership with Fabienne Goutier and Organizasyon Sante Peyi Pam (OSPP) helped restore access to critical healthcare in Haiti at a time of extreme instability and fear. Services provided included general medicine, pediatrics, OB/GYN care, dental services, and one end-of-life care case.



As a direct result of these clinics, **five patients** were referred for emergency surgery, all of which were successfully completed. For many patients, this was the first medical care they had received since 2019, following years of disruption due to COVID-19 and the widespread control of armed gangs. The clinics were hosted in a church-based safe space, allowing displaced families to receive care, openly share their symptoms, and find dignity and reassurance during a time of trauma and uncertainty.

Haiti (Education)

Vision of Grace Elementary School and Community Project

Over the past year, ImpactHope's partnership with the school in Haiti has helped provide consistent education, nourishment, and spiritual formation for children living amid ongoing economic and social instability.

By the end of the school year (**October-December 2025**), enrollment grew to **135 children**, with staffing expanded to **8 certified teachers**, along with administrative and support staff.

Despite national challenges, enrollment increased, teaching quality was strengthened through full government certification of all teachers, and classrooms and playground areas were maintained and improved. Most importantly, the **school nutrition program continued uninterrupted**, ensuring that every student received balanced meals each school day.

Key Statistics & Measurable Impact

- **135 children** currently enrolled, with approximately 97 continuing from the previous year
- More than **30% of students** showed **academic improvement** in core subjects such as Language and Mathematics
- Preschool 1 through Grade 6 fully operational
- **Sports program** were launched to support holistic child development



Impact Story: Never Too Late to Learn

At 15 years old, Davidson is experiencing school for the very first time. Circumstances once prevented him from enrolling, but today he attends classes daily, eager to learn. Though older than his classmates, Davidson is thriving thanks to patient teachers and a community that believes education can begin at any age. His journey is a powerful reminder that opportunity can change a life—no matter when it begins.



Nutrition



135 students | 11 teachers & staff

Students receive warm, nutritious meals every school day. For many children, this is the most reliable—and sometimes the only—complete meal they receive, directly supporting focus, attendance, and learning outcomes.

Hogar Genesis, Iquitos



In Iquitos, Peru, children living in extreme vulnerability face daily risks of neglect, exploitation, hunger, and instability. Through a children's home called **Hogar Génesis**, the **Belén Kids Ministry**, and ongoing **street outreach**, Rodolfo Córdova and his local team continue to provide safety, dignity, and hope to children and families who need it most.

Highlights

- **16 children** received full-time care at Hogar Génesis
- **40-60 children** weekly reached through Belén Kids Ministry
- **2,880 plates of food** distributed throughout the year
- **120 families** directly impacted
- **20 children** received education support
- **60 individuals** reached through street ministry
- **15 staff members** serving daily
- **3 dedicated volunteers** supporting programs



Belén Kids



40-60 Children/week
Provided with breakfast, education, and devotion to children in Belen every Saturday.

Street Ministry



60 people were offered food, clothing, and spiritual support to those trapped in addiction and violence.

Family Ministry



120+ Families in need were provided food, medical supplies, and legal advice.

Impact Stories: A Fresh Start For Luz

When 6-year-old Luz María arrived at Hogar Génesis this year, she carried a story far heavier than her small frame. Coming from an unsafe and violent environment, she had never experienced consistent meals, schooling, or a place where she could simply be a child.

But everything changed the moment she walked through the doors of Hogar Génesis.

Today, Luz María is thriving. Thanks to this loving home – and the generosity of supporters like you.

She's in her final year of kindergarten, learning her favourite subject – math – and dreaming big dreams of becoming a doctor someday. She spends her afternoons drawing, playing outside, and laughing with the other girls... things she never had the chance to enjoy before.



Servicios Médicos Vida y Esperanza (Life and Hope Medical Services)

Under the leadership of Dr. Juan Pablo and his wife Carolina, the Servicios Médicos Vida y Esperanza hospital in Nebaj has blessed countless individuals. Their unwavering commitment to serving vulnerable communities has created a sustainable healthcare system that not only addresses critical medical needs but also empowers the local population through education, compassion, and opportunity.

- **5,813 patient consultations** were provided in 2025, reflecting the hospital's expanding reach and its vital role as a trusted healthcare provider in the region.
- **667 patients** received healthcare free of charge, ensuring that the most vulnerable families could access medical care regardless of their ability to pay.
- **1,125 ultrasounds** and **832 X-rays** were conducted this year, enabling accurate diagnoses and timely treatment for thousands of patients who otherwise would have limited access to diagnostic imaging.
- The hospital laboratory performed **27,723 tests** in 2025, supporting preventive care, early diagnosis, and effective treatment across a wide range of medical needs.
- In-patient care increased significantly, with **156 patients** encamados (hospitalized) in 2025, compared to 59 in 2024—a clear indication of both rising need and the hospital's growing capacity to care for critically ill patients.
- The **continued increase in patients receiving free and subsidized care** highlights the deepening healthcare needs and economic challenges faced by families in the Nebaj region.



Hebron Vida y Esperanza School

- **60 kids** enrolled
- Students benefit from a well-rounded learning environment that includes academic instruction, art, music, and character development, helping them grow in confidence and creativity.



Nursing School

- Trains local students to become qualified nurses, strengthening long-term healthcare capacity in the region
- **40 students** enrolled in Quiché and **37 students** enrolled in Nebaj
- Graduates go on to serve in hospitals, clinics, and rural communities with limited access to healthcare
- **3 students** currently supported through donor-sponsored scholarships
- Nursing education provides a **sustainable solution** to healthcare shortages while transforming lives through opportunity and service



Impact Story: Evan Israel's Story - Care When It Matters Most



in December, in the small village of Ilom in Chajul, Quiché, a newborn baby boy was found abandoned in a field. His parents are still unknown. Neighbors nearby discovered him and rushed him to the local health center in Ilom, doing everything they could to protect his fragile life.

Today, baby Evan Israel is under the custody of Guatemala's child protection services (PGN) and receiving care at the National Hospital in Nebaj. When doctors noticed that Evan had a small but concerning infection in his eyes, they reached out for help.

Because of generous donor support, medication was quickly provided. That simple act—timely medicine, given with compassion—helped protect Evan's health during an incredibly vulnerable moment in his life. Evan's story is a reminder that, in Nebaj, the hospital is often the last and safest place for those with nowhere else to turn.

Food Security & Community in Cuba

The year 2025 was one of the most difficult Cuba has faced in recent history. Ongoing economic collapse, food shortages, rising costs, energy instability, and natural disasters left many families struggling simply to survive. Vulnerable groups—seniors, single mothers, children, and pastoral families—were especially affected.

In the midst of these challenges, ImpactHope's partners in **Palma Soriano and Camagüey** continued to serve faithfully. Through food assistance, pastoral support, children's programs, and emergency relief, the ministry brought practical help and spiritual encouragement—reminding people that God has not forgotten them.

- **Over 160 families** impacted through **food and essential aid**
- **10 pastors** and their families supported monthly
- **418 children** per day reached during 4-day **Vacation Bible School**
- **252 children** received food support through **children's programs**
- **Seniors** from 5 families supported monthly (approx. **60** individuals)
- **50 families** assisted after Hurricane Melissa
- **Emergency roofing materials** provided to families who lost their homes



All families served were active members of local churches, strengthening both community resilience and church ministry.

Key Areas of Ministry

- **Food & Family Support:** Food assistance remained the most urgent need.
- **Pastoral Support:** Pastors and their families often serve with little or no income. Monthly support for 10 pastoral families helped provide food stability.
- **Children's Ministry:** In Palma Soriano, VBS served hundreds of children daily—sharing God's Word and providing meals many children would not otherwise receive. In Camagüey, leaders prayerfully prioritized food relief as costs increased.
- **Emergency Response:** Following Hurricane Melissa, 50 families were provided with food and roofing materials.



Impact Story: Strengthened to Serve

Yasmany and Yoneidy are a young couple and church leaders raising their teenage daughter in a modest home. Their income comes from reselling bread and night security work. Monthly support from ImpactHope helped ensure their family had food during an incredibly difficult year.

They shared heartfelt gratitude to God and to the donors whose generosity allowed them to continue serving faithfully—without the constant fear of not being able to provide.



Birthing & Community Care in Mexico

Key Impact (2025)

- **447 total consultations** provided, including prenatal, postpartum, general, nutrition, counselling, and ultrasound services
- **198 prenatal consultations**, ensuring mothers received consistent care throughout pregnancy
- **25 postpartum visits**, supporting recovery and newborn health
- **32 counselling sessions**, addressing emotional and spiritual well-being
- **19 nutrition consultations**, helping mothers build healthier pregnancies
- **37 general** medical consultations
- **116 ultrasounds**, restoring a critical diagnostic service for expectant mothers
- **20 Pap smears**, supporting women's long-term health

Birth Outcomes:

- **19 births** supported in total
- **14 births** safely attended at Casa Compasiva
- **5 hospital births** accompanied and supported by the Casa team



Programs & Education:

- **9 prenatal courses** offered to prepare families for birth
- **10 postnatal care** programs, supporting mothers after delivery
- **20 care packages** distributed to families of premature babies, offering comfort and practical support during a vulnerable time

Outreach & Brigades:

- **6 external medical and dental** brigades extended care beyond Casa Compasiva into surrounding communities



Impact Story: Sofía's Courage

At just 15 years old, Sofía was pressured by the public health system to end her pregnancy. Instead, she chose to protect her baby's life. With the support of her family and the compassionate care of Casa Compasiva, Sofía received the vitamins and prenatal support she needed—made possible through donor generosity.

She later gave birth naturally to a healthy baby boy, Elías. What began as a moment of fear became a powerful story of courage, dignity, and hope. Because of supporters like you, young mothers like Sofía are given care, respect, and the chance to choose life.

A significant milestone this year was the launch of Casa Ben Victoria, a new chapter serving impoverished communities and families at the pediatric cancer hospital in Victoria, Mexico. Led by longtime Casa Ben volunteer Julia, this outreach provided nourishing meals to grateful patients and caregivers, offering comfort during deeply challenging moments.
